<u>The Federation named below ("the Federation")</u>A hereby declares, in respect of other federations participating in eduGAIN as listed on the eduGAIN website ("the Participating Federations") that it wishes to participate in eduGAIN, and that it is aware of will comply with the eduGAIN constitution Policy Framework, and that:

- 1. Subject to clause 2 below, it will publish technical descriptions of the networked computers that <u>act as AAI endpoints</u> (for example to provide the functions of identity provider, <u>attribute provider or and</u> service provider) ("the Entities") which have been validated for use in the <u>Federation</u> according to its normal operational standards.
- 2. Publications under clause 1 above will be at the request of the member-Member who controls each Entity.
- 3. It will make Entity descriptions provided by other Participating Federations available to <u>members Members of the Federation—A</u>, who may make use of them at their own discretion to establish trusted communications between Entities.
- 4. It will inform other Participating Federations promptly <u>publish</u> of any subsequent changes to Entity descriptions previously published.
- 5. It will inform other Participating Federations the eduGAIN Operational Team promptly of any changes affecting either the validation of Entities or the process for publishing Entity descriptions.
- 6. It will provide such assistance to other Participating Federations as they may reasonably request concerning the publication or use of Entity Descriptions.
- 7. It will provide the eduGAIN Operational Team with such documentation and agreements as may be necessary to demonstrate compliance with eduGAIN's basic level of trust, as defined in the eduGAIN Constitution and, where appropriate, such documentation and agreements as may be required to support enhanced levels of trust.
- 8. The behaviour of any member Member of any Participating Federation whose Entity description is published shall continue to be bound only by the rules of that Participating Federation.
- 9. In particular any complaint about a <u>member_Member_shall</u> be made to the operator of its Participating Federation and dealt with between that <u>member_Member_and</u> and that operator according to the rules of that Participating Federation and subject only to that Participating Federation's governing law and jurisdiction.
- 10. Neither the existence of this declaration nor the exchange of information enabled by it shall create any new legal obligations or rights between <u>members</u> or operators of any federation.
- 11. In particular this declaration creates no rights of membership, nor of access to services, between members Members of any federation.
- 12. Any disagreement between Participating Federations shall be resolved by discussion between the respective Participating Federations or their successors and assigns.
- 13. No financial consideration will be expected between <u>the Federation-A</u> and other Participating Federations as federation operators and any financial consideration between <u>members-Members or members-Members and operators</u> or <u>members-Members and operators</u> or <u>members and operators and operators are not the members and operators a</u>
- 14. It will, in the event that it no longer wishes to participate in eduGAIN, give timely advance notice to both its own members and the eduGAIN Operations Operational Team in accordance with the eduGAIN constitution.
